All About Grave Markers

Every grave sold by the Catholic Cemeteries allows for a specific type of memorial for aesthetic, operational and maintenance reasons. When a family purchases a grave or lot, the only type of memorial that can be erected is the one reflected in the burial rights agreement.

Our non-commissioned family service counselors can custom design a meaningful, lasting monument or grave marker based upon your wishes and the specifications of your grave or lot utilizing a variety of different mediums such as granite, marble, sculpture, bronze and stained glass. We will assist you through the entire process from the design phase to the installation of your memorial.

Based upon the grave or lot restrictions, you can place one of potentially four different types of headstones. These include a **Monument**, **Slant** Marker, **Bevel** Marker or **Level** Marker. Monuments are typically the most expensive, as they require the most stone material. Slant markers are sometimes compared to a wedge of cheese: straight in the back but slanted in the front. Bevels are also called pillow markers, as they are boxy and small, but raised several inches off the ground. Level markers are similar to a bevel but are flush with the ground.

Veteran markers and bronze medallions issued by the government are permitted in the Catholic Cemeteries as well. Our family service counselors can assist you in the application process and choosing the type of veteran marker permitted. While there is no charge for the marker, there is a cemetery fee for the concrete foundation and setting of the marker. The military separation or discharge papers (DD-214) will be needed to apply for these veteran's benefits.

Our memorial department can also assist you with inscriptions, artwork, permanent vases, professional cleaning, repair, and maintenance work to an existing monument or marker. Please call our office at (502) 451-7710 for more information.

Upcoming Availability at Calvary

We have been working on quite a bit behind the scenes! For the past several years, new sections have been in the works. You may have seen them if you've visited Calvary in that time — large undeveloped areas past Section 37. They look park-like with gently sloping hills, trees, and beautiful views of Bellarmine's tower and the rest of Calvary Cemetery. These areas are just part of the dozens of acres we are planning to incorporate for burials, with an emphasis on new cremation spaces as the popularity of cremation is expected to continue rising.

As of right now, we have Section 40 completely open for burials, with parts of Sections 38 and 39 soon to be available as well. We will be developing more of that area with time.

We also have our new columbarium complex, Our Lady of Peace, opening in Section 7. The 4 new structures offer hundreds of single and double niches, and are located in one of the most scenic parts of Calvary Cemetery. While the area is still under construction and not yet available for purchase, we are anticipating being able to make that area available in the coming months.

NATURE & WILDLIFE

What To Know About Coyotes at Calvary



Every spring and summer we see an influx of wildlife on our grounds, and so far this year we have already had multiple reports of coyote sightings on our grounds. The undeveloped areas on the outskirts of Calvary, which are wooded and run next to Beargrass Creek, are the primary places they are spotted, however that does not mean they won't roam.

If you are on our grounds and spot a coyote, don't panic. They are more afraid of you than you are of them. This time of the year, adult female coyotes are protecting their cubs. Getting you to leave the area is what they want.

That said, we encourage caution — especially if you have a dog with you. Remember to keep your dog on a leash at all times, and don't allow them to wander out of sight. We want to keep our families & their pets safe while also recognizing that wild animals, such as coyotes, are an inescapable part of our environment and should be respected as such.
